Jesus said, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28–30).

Do not delay in coming to Jesus. Nobody knows the day of his or her own death. Behold, now is the day of salvation. Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved.

Whenever you go traveling, may you be constantly reminded of your own life journey and consider where you are ultimately headed. Even with the advanced communication methods available today, nothing beats seeing and catching up with a loved one face-to-face, enjoying one another's presence. For some, returning home could also mean an opportunity for reconciliation or reunion.

Going back to where we originally came from is a good practice. It is quite an experience to visit the place of one's birth and childhood. What precious memories! What warmth in the heart, and what desire to better relationships! Though shortlived, such moments are meaningful enough for us to seek them often. But alas, not everyone appreciates such a practice of home-going.

This is similar to the ignorance of those who do not realise where their spirits will one day return — to the God who gave them life.

Concerning the end of a man, the Holy Bible says: "Then shall the dust return to the earth as it was: and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it" (Ecclesiastes 12:7).
